

Can you help the meadowlark get back to her nest?

The nestlings are hungry (they are always hungry!), and the mother has to get back with food. Her nest is hidden in a thick clump of grass, sheltered with a dome of grass and shrub stems. But ground nests are always in danger from predators. She has to be on the watch for a Red-tailed Hawk or a bobcat.

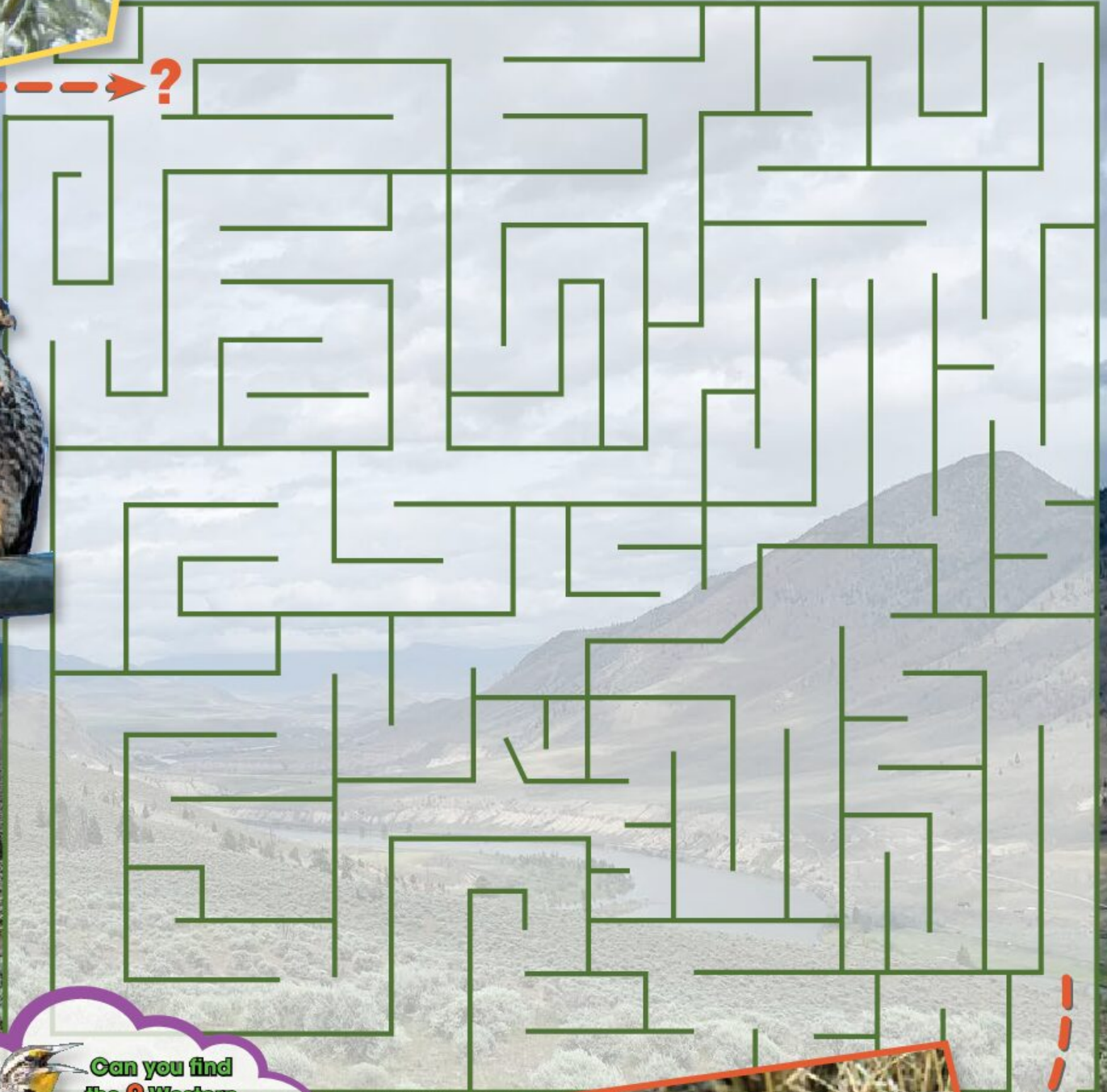
